Open Government Partnership National Action Plan 2013-2014 Self-Evaluation Report

INTRODUCTION

Hungary's Commitment

The Funadamental Law of Hungary announced on 25 April, 2011 and entered into force on 1 January, 2012 lays down several fundamental principles determining the form and content of governance and decision-making. The Fundamental Law stipulates, among others that Hungary shall enforce the principle of balanced, transparent and sustainable budget management [Article N paragraph (1)]. A significant fundamental principle consistently enforced by the courts since the period of the 1989 change of regime is that every person shall have the right to the protection of his or her personal data, as well as to have access to and impart information of public interest [Article VI paragraph (2)]. In order to enhance its more efficient functioning, increase the quality of its public services, achieve greater transparency in public affairs, and to promote equal opportunities, the State shall endeavour the application of new technological solutions and the achievements of science [Article XXVI]. Pursuant to the provision of the Fundamental Law on a transparent budget the bills on the central budget and on its implementation shall contain the state expenditures and revenues in the same structure, in a transparent manner and in reasonable detail [Article 36 paragraph (2)]. The Fundamental Law sets out important requirements to the Government by stipulating that the Government shall implement the Act on the central budget lawfully and expediently, with efficient management of public funds and ensuring transparency [Article 37 paragraph (1)].

In implementing the provisions of the Fundamental Law there are special responsibilities resting with the Government as the general organ defining the preparation and enforcement of decision-making. From among the four open government objectives (enhancing access to government data, supporting social participation, applying the highest level of professional integrity in public administration, new technologies for openness and accountability) defined by the Open Government Partnership initiative, Hungary has laid emphasis on strengthening the integrity of public administration. The primary reason for this is that in 2011 the Government launched a large-scale public administration development programme and in connection with this programme also adopted a two year programme for the prevention of corruption and the strengthening of integrity. Accession to the Open Government Partnership initiative and the adoption of the Action Plan on Hungary's commitments has given new impetus to and provided new partnership experiences for the transformation of Hungarian public administration. In accordance with the preparation of this self-evaluation report, Hungary hereby re-enforces his commitment to the principles of the Open Government Declaration and to the active participation in the Open Government Partnership initiative.

Accession to the Open Government Partnership initiative

The idea of Hungary's accession to the Open Government Partnership (OGP) initiative was raised in the course of the preparation of the corruption prevention programme in February, 2012. The proposal received from the civil society was adopted and the preparation of accession to the Open Government Declaration incorporated by the Government into the tasks set out by Government Decree No. 1104/2012. (IV. 6.).

Following technical preparation the Government adopted in July, 2012 Government Decree No. 1227/2012. (VII. 6.) on Hungary's accession to the Open Government Partnership international initiative, on the basis of which Hungary joined the Open Government Partnership initiative of the acceding countries. With consideration to the fact that Hungary acceded to the initiative among the cohort 3 countries Hungary had to prepare its first Action Plan by the end of March, 2013. The preparatory work was started in September, 2012 following the announcement of accession.

PREPARATION OF THE NATIONAL ACTION PLAN

Consultation in the course of preparation

The first civil proposals for the contents of the National Action Plan for the Open Government Partnership were already submitted in May, 2012 to the Ministry of Public Administration and Justice responsible for the preparation of the OGP Action Plan. In the course of the preparation, in September, 2012, the ministry first presented the objectives of the Open Government Partnership initiative and the process of developing and implementing the Hungarian Action Plan at the consultations that were also attended by the representatives of the organs of public administration, then in two rounds also discussed the evolving action plan with the civil organisations that attended the former anti-corruption consultations. On the basis of the consultations and the proposals of the civil organisations the first draft of the National Action Plan was developed. Prior to the approval of the draft, in accordance with the law, the Government submitted the draft electronically for a 15-day social consultation, ensuring the possibility for every citizen to make comments and proposals.

Following the closure of the consultations, in February the Government discussed and adopted Government Decision No. 1080/2013 (II.25.) on the approval of the Action Plan on Hungary's commitments to be made in the framework of the Open Government Partnership international initiative. The approved Action Plan set out the objective to strengthen the integrity of public administration. An important aspect in defining the commitments was to set realistic objectives and ensure the financial conditions required for implementation.

The Ministry of Public Administration and Justice responsible for the implementation submitted the National Action Plan to the OGP Steering Committee, and then presented it to the countries participating in the initiative at the OGP Meeting held in London, in April, 2013. As a result of the long consultation process of multiple rounds also providing the opportunity for commenting in person and in writing, Hungary's first Open Government Action Plan is a document that also takes the professional opinions and social requirements into consideration and lays great emphasis on the

feasibility of the measures and positive acceptance of the initiative by pubic administration and the society. Given the fact that the Open Government Partnership is to be considered a new initiative, the Government expects the successful implementation of the first Action Plan to give impetus to setting further ambitious objectives.

Consultation in the course of implementation

Following the ad-hoc preparatory consultations with the civil society, in December, 2012 the Government established a high-level Civil Consultation Forum to follow-up, among other things, the approval and implementation of the OGP Action Plan. At the new consultations held on a monthly basis the interested organisations were given regular information on the status of implementing the Hungarian Action Plan, the achieved results and the planned measures. At the consultations the Government was represented at the Secretary of State level, therefore, the participants had the opportunity to meet experts and directly contact the political leaders and learn information from them. Memorandum were prepared about the consultations and also submitted to the participants in a written form.

In April, 2013 five civil organisations attending the consultations decided not to participate future consultations because of the amendment of the Act on informational self-determination and freedom of information ("Privacy Act"), so the consultations were held during the period until the 2014 elections without the participation of the representatives of these organisations.

From 1 March, 2013, the Ministry of Public Administration and Justice launched a website in Hungarian (<u>http://korrupciomegelozes.kormany.hu/</u>) and in English (<u>http://corruptionprevention.gov.hu</u>) to follow-up the implementation of the Open Government Partnership National Action Plan. The website served to inform the broader public on the current issues and consultations on the implementation of the National Action Plan and provided access to the documents related to the implementation of the Action Plan.

In addition to the consultation with the citizens and civil organisations the Ministry of Public Administration and Justice responsible for the implementation of the National Action Plan laid also great emphasis on cooperation with the other organs of public administration. In implementing the Hungarian Action Plan the Ministry closely cooperated, among others, with the State Audit Office, National University of Public Service, Hungarian Government Officials Corps, Hungarian State Treasury, Ministry of National Development, Ministry of the Interior, and Office of the Commissioner for Fundamental Rights.

Consultation in the course of self-evaluation

In the new government structure being established after the April, 2014 elections the Open Government Partnership tasks were taken over by the Ministry of the Interior, meaning that the preparation of the self-evaluation report on the implementation of the National Action Plan was already a task of this ministry. Independently of the transformation of the government structure also the Ministry of the Interior lays great emphasis on the dialogue with the social partners.

Prior to finalisation, the Hungarian self-evaluation report prepared following the expert consultation was submitted by the ministry for a two week social debate on the government website and the http://korrupciomegelozes.kormany.hu website. The summary of the consultation results prepared by the Ministry of the Interior are available on the http://korrupciomegelozes.kormany.hu website.

IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMMITMENTS IN THE NATIONAL ACTION PLAN

The major part of the commitments in the National Action Plan have significantly or fully been performed (75%) but there are also other commitments the implementation of which requires further measures. The status of the implementation of the Action Plan is shown in the below summary table and the most essential information on the various commitments are detailed under Commitments in Annex No. 2. (The additional commitments presented at the London OGP Summit and included in the next Action Plan are not contained in this table.)

SUMMARY OF EXPERIENCES

Since it was in 2012 that Hungary acceded to the Open Government Partnership initiative during the 2012-2014 period the country had the simultaneous task to learn the organisation's mechanism, prepare and implement the National Action Plan. The implementation of the commitments was facilitated by the fact that the Ministry of Public Administration and Justice was the primary and single organ responsible for implementation. Although this organisational solution facilitated the implementation of the tasks, due to the scope of tasks and authority of the Ministry of Public Administration and Justice it also meant overburden on the ministry's available human resources. In implementing the tasks the Ministry of Public Administration and Justice continuously endeavoured to cooperate with the civil organisations and have a direct, high-level dialogue. To this end, from the end of 2012, the technical consultations were conducted with a monthly frequency, at the Secretary of State level, allowing the civil organisations concerned to have direct dialogue with the decision-makers.

At the start of the programme the effort to reduce the lack of trust between the Government and various representatives of the civil society was successful only to a certain extent and further close and confidence-building cooperation is needed to enhance it.

Hungary's accession to the Open Government Partnership initiative also represented multiple advantages, such as:

- focusing the attention to the importance of open governance;
- contributing to the learning of international good practices;
- providing framework for the Government developments related to the issue;
- providing the opportunity for closer cooperation with the citizens, civil society organisations and governmental organs .

In developing and implementing the first National Action Plan numerous experiences have been accumulated, which can be utilised in preparing and implementing the second National Action Plan. The most important experiences are:

- common efforts and results enhance confidence between the cooperating partners (citizens, civil society, business sector, government);
- in the future greater emphasis shall be laid on cooperation with the business sector;
- Hungary shall cooperate more actively in the international scene by sharing its knowledge and good experiences related to the issue;

• the implementation of the Action Plan requires to mobilise capacities higher than those existing and Hungary's political commitment for open government shall be further strengthened.

In accordance with the Act the scope of authority of the commissioner for fundamental rights was extended also including the inspection of handling the reports, and from 1 January, 2014 the protected electronic system of public interest disclosures started operation, providing the opportunity through the commissioner's office for electronic and anonymous reporting.
